

**Restocking and Enforcement Notice Inspection**

**Notes**

Restock areas A,B and C have been restocked. The ratio of restocked to felled trees has achieved the 5:1 ratio detailed in the EN and the stocking density is deemed appropriate for the site with replacement trees filling in where there are large enough gaps in the canopy. The restocked trees are all sessile oak and have been planted adequately and protected from deer sufficiently with staked tubes to support establishment.

To confirm compliance with the EN the site may need to be inspected again once the EN compliance date has passed on the 18/02/2022.


